Opioid Fatalities in Westchester Increased

More than 200% from 2010-2015

- 27 (2010)
- 50 (2011)
- 48 (2012)
- 67 (2013)
- 59 (2014)
- 83 (2015)
- 59 (2016)

^{*} Westchester County had the 3rd highest percentage of drug deaths per 100,000 from 5.4 to 12 according to a report by the Rockefeller Institute of Government that analyzed data from 2010-2015.

Four Foundational Blocks

- **1.** <u>Education</u> Inform the public about the scope, causes, and consequences of the problem.
- **2.** <u>Prevention</u> Understand the pain points physical and emotional that can lead to addiction.
- Integration Coordinate resources to produce the most effective response possible.
- **4.** <u>Action</u> Involve everyone with a stake in the outcome sooner, not later.
